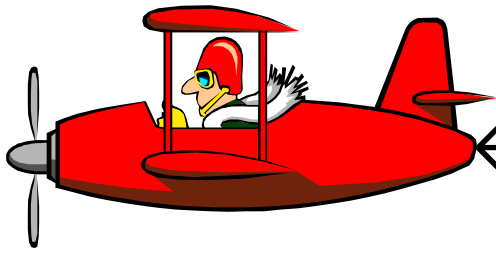

The Severn River Lions Club was recently awarded banner patches in recognition of **International Twinning** and accomplishments in **Service to Youth and Children**.

For the past year, our club has been twinning with the Severn Dean Lions Club in Gloucester, England and the Zaanstreek Lions Club in Holland. The twinning has involved an exchange of information about the clubs, their geographic location, club activities and fundraising events. Our club now has another banner patch to recognize this relationship and the European clubs have been presented a certificate. Twinning emphasizes that our Lions program is international in scope and service to the community knows no boundaries.

The **Share Success Through Service to Youth and Children** patch is one our club can point to with pride. International President Clem Kusiak initiated this award and encouraged all clubs to extend programs and activities that would involve youth. The patch was awarded for our club's sponsorship of two LEO Clubs, active participation in the annual Peace Poster contest, financial assistance to Troop 216, Boy Scouts of America, a troop for handicapped boys, sponsorship of Cub Scout Pack 688, annual scholarships for seniors at Severna Park and Broadneck High Schools, a scholarship at Anne Arundel Community College, trophies provided for the annual Severna Park High Tournament of Bands, and the financial support made available to band members.

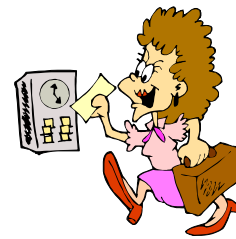

The Board of Directors meeting was held at Jaycees Center at Kinder Park and was called to order by KL Oriey at 7:30 pm.

Announcements – KL mentioned that Lion Ulysses had given the Loan Closet a motorized wheelchair.

Secretary's Report – Secretary distributed minutes of the regular Board meeting held 4/12 and the Special Board Meeting held 4/19, noted that they had been included in the May newsletter and asked if anyone had any corrections; minutes were approved as presented.

Treasurer's Report – Lion Bill O'Neil passed out copies of Activities budget, reviewed where we stand, and led discussion on where to put discretionary donations. He reported bank account balances as follows:

Correspondence – Secretary reviewed correspondence which included request for monies for a gift for DG. Motion made, seconded, and carried to send \$1/member (\$70) for gift.

PRIORITY ITEMS

Bull and Oyster Roast – Lion Nancy reported currently profit about \$4,030 with \$350 coming from American Legion for tickets that had been stolen.

MD22 Convention Resolutions – Secretary read three resolutions that were to be presented at Convention. Motion made, seconded, and carried to support the resolutions.

Antique/Collectibles/Crafts Fair – Lion Nancy noted contracts and flyers were ready; requested permission to put ad in newspaper for Crafts dealers. It was moved, seconded, and carried that Nancy be permitted to spend up to \$100 at her discretion for expenses.

OLD BUSINESS

Children's Fair – Lion Dick reported that we had had a very successful day and performed 60 preschool vision screenings and took 183 pictures; also that we had sold about 12,000 tickets for food.

Vision Screening – Lion Dale Strait reported that the St. Martins screening on 5/9 had been successful with 83 children screened in two sessions.

Other – Lion Ollie is looking for volunteers for screenings on 5/18, 19; Lion Dale mentioned that those going to convention would meet at Rockefeller's at 5 pm on 5/12.

Lion Jon Valett noted that Broadneck members wanted to disband Broadneck as a Branch in favor of being regular members of Severn River. He moved that the Broadneck Branch of the SRLC would become inactive effective July 1, 2005. While SRLC would continue to support club projects in the Broadneck peninsula, and at a

later date may again try to form a club in that area, at this time, the current Branch club would become inactive. The members of the Broadneck Branch will no longer hold the special billing status that allowed them to be billed for meals only for the meetings that they attend. All Broadneck Branch members will become regular active members of the SRLC (effectively this only changes their billing status) starting July 1, 2005. This means that any Broadneck Branch club member that would like any other membership status (such as affiliate), should make that request to the board by July 1, 2005. The motion was seconded by Lion Nancy and after some discussion, the motion passed with regrets.

NEW BUSINESS

Blood Drive June 13 – Lion Dale announced that the next blood drive would be June 13th and noted signup sheet would be passed around at General Membership meetings between now and then.

Rebuilding Together – though not present, KL noted that Lion George was looking for volunteers for the coming Saturday.

Other Items – Post 175 seeking assistance with technology; at Children's Fair we were given a hometown hero award.

Meeting was adjourned at 9:10 pm. , Respectfully submitted, Secretary Sue Parks

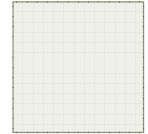
