LASH EYEGLASS SORTING

The Lions Association for Sight & Hearing of Maryland held its semiannual collection of eyeglasses, hearing aids and cellphones from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. April 10. District 22-A Lions Clubs brought donations from their servicing area to the drop off point in Dundalk. Thirty-six boxes of 500 eyeglasses each were collected along with some 50 sets of hearing aids and 200 cellphones.

The eyeglasses will be shipped to a company that will refurbish and ship them to those in need in South America and Africa. The hearing aids will go to the Towson University Speech, Language and Hearing Center to be refurbished under contract and then issued to clients who could otherwise not afford them. The cellphones will go to a veterans organization that will send them to be recycled for cash. The cash is then used to purchase phone cards to issue to troops overseas to use to call home.

6. Texas Roadhouse - Lion Suzette reported that Texas Roadhouse has allowed us to use the same URL for the next three fundraiser campaigns selling e-gift cards. They are willing to continue our partnership. Suzette is using social media to announce these fundraisers.

7. Eyeglass sorting: Lion Carl reported LASH would be picking up recycled glasses on 11 April between 11am and 2pm. Clubs have been asked to sanitize, sort, and box/bag prior to bringing glasses to pickup. After discussion Lion Carl directed to pick site, date, and time for doing the sorting.

8. ZOOM issues: Lion Carl can make the 3 fruit sale laptops available to members that do not have audio/visual capability on their computers, however they are WIFI only. Also recording the meeting to evaluate how useful than woul be.
