The activity, known as Hop, Skip and Jump 5K involved walking and running around the park trail which is about three miles in length and circles the entire park. Runners and walkers started at the River Birch pavilion and set out on the trail. Lions served as guides at several points along the scenic trail and helped keep the participant "on track.". This was a charitable event and proceeds will benefit the AA Special Needs Program. The weather for the 5K Walk and Run was good -cloudy but cool and was perfect for this type of event. The event lasted about two hours before all participants returned to the pavilion. Severn River Lions had assisted with a similar event at Kinder Park several years ago and they are certain to be invited back again. 
