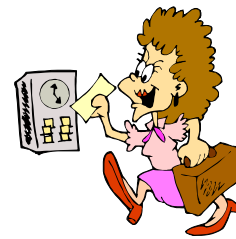
Share Success through Lions Services for Children

The Board of Directors meeting was held at Jaycees Center at Kinder Park and was called to order by KL Oriey at 7:30 pm.

PRIORITY ITEMS

March Fruit Sale – No report.

Review SRLC Annual Activities Report – Lion Sue reviewed the activities report and questioned whether we would make LVRF donation (motion made and passed to make \$310 of the budgeted amount now – after we find out what we have available in June, we would review for further donation); mentioned that public relations articles were due by 3/31; and that we were on target in all other award categories except membership.

OLD BUSINESS

Charter Night – KL noted that Lion Don Rayment should be commended for great success.

LEOs – Lion Nancy noted that Youth Rise LEOs would be at Severna Park Library for Liberty Day on March 16th; further noted continued projects for Children's Oncology unit at Johns Hopkins; and that they were putting together school supplies for tsunami relief efforts. Lion Bill Z requested that Nancy encourage them to submit write-up for News & Views.

Membership Report – Lion Ken Tschantre distributed team listing and noted that the letter we had worked on would also be distributed at the general membership meeting.

Other Items/Reports:

Lion Bob Muchow mentioned the LCI dinner on April 5th that was open to all members and a good opportunity to meet the international guests.

NEW BUSINESS

Children's Fair – Lion Dick Maurer announced that we would again be participating in the Children's Fair at Big Vanilla Racquet Club in Severna Park on Saturday, May 7th. Like last year, we will sell the tickets for various food items outside and do vision screening inside.

Food Booths – Lion Dick Maurer reported further that there would be no Spring Fest again this year at Kinder Park but that we would be doing the Fall Fest there on October 8th. He also indicated that we had been invited to participate in Shipley Choices Fall Fest and would get back to us with more information (date) as soon as it was available.

Liberty Day Kids – Lion Ollie quizzed us on the constitution and then indicated that we were sponsoring two groups of kids for this worthwhile endeavor – one in Annapolis with the Annapolis Area Christian School kids and one at the Severna Park Library with kids from Severna Park Middle School Youth Rise LEOs.

Cub Scout 75th Anniversary Ideas – Lion Ollie noted that they were exploring ideas for celebrating Cub Scout's 75th Anniversary – some of those ideas – plant a tree at Kinder Park, draft article for newsletter, take group shot with photo display.

Twinning Update

You'll remember last month we mentioned that the Ironbridge-Severn Gorge Lions in Shropshire, England celebrated their Charter Night on February 19 and that we had sent a letter, an SRLC banner, decals, and a copy of our club newsletter to our fellow Lions. Here is some communication we received in return from Lion Ray Dawson, Secretary of Ironbridge Severn Gorge: "Easter is a busy time for us, as we have three fundraisers on the go. Firstly we have a number of Easter Bunnies in local pubs (bars to you I guess?), they are in a guess the name competition with customers purchasing a numbered square, the winning one is revealed when all squares are sold. We usually raise about £1,000 in this way. We are also doing a "can rattle" outside of a local supermarket on Good Friday & Easter Saturday. Funds raised will go to sponsor a bed in a local hospital and also support the DG's partners appeal which is Child Flight. Finally Easter Sunday sees the first "Silver Over the Bridge" of the year. We do this once per month during the summer months. We use the Ironbridge that I sent a photo of. Basically we progressively stretch an adhesive tape (sticky side up) across the bridge and invite visitors to place silver coins on the tape. We raise about £300 each time with no real outlay and just 5 or 6 hours effort. It is also good PR as we meet many people, including visitors to the UK and often fellow Lions. If you have a suitable bridge could be a good one for you. if you have not already thought of it."

PACK 688 SCOUTS CELEBRATE THE BIRTHDAY OF CUB SCOUTING

Boys and their families in Cub Scout Pack 688 celebrated Cub Scouting's 75th anniversary at their annual Blue and Gold Banquet on February 13. Held at the Glen Burnie Elks Lodge in Severn, the event featured a delicious spaghetti dinner, birthday cake, awards ceremony, and entertainment by Secret Agent Magician James Wand. Over 200 people attended, including Scouts and their family members.

Traditionally at Pack 688's Blue and Gold Banquet, second-year Webelos Scouts receive the Arrow of Light, the highest award a Cub Scout can earn. Additionally, these same boys bridge into the Boy Scout Troop of their choice in a moving ceremony. A boy bids his parents and the Cub Scout program farewell and walks across a decorative bridge, greeted by a Boy Scout from his new Troop. "It is a very touching occasion for the Scouts and their families," said Bob Bieri, Cubmaster of Pack 688 "It is a rite of passage, part of growing up, and exciting to witness year after year."

It is interesting to note that the boys at this year's Blue and Gold banquet will also experience the 100th anniversary of Boy Scouting in 2010. This group of boys will have celebrated both the 75th anniversary of Cub Scouting, and the 100th anniversary of Boy Scouting.

Pack 688 meets monthly at Shipley's Choice Elementary School, and is chartered by the Severn River Lions Club. Over 75 families from the Shipley's Choice and the surrounding community enjoy "fun, family and friends" and benefit from the timeless values Scouting teaches.

Boy Scouting was founded in 1910 as a program for older boys. The program met great success, and many younger brothers began coming to the Boy Scout meetings. In order to serve the needs of the younger boys, "Cubbing" was launched in 1930 as a program for boys beginning at age 8. The name was eventually changed to "Cub Scouting," and in 2003 over 1.9 million boys were registered as Cub Scouts nationwide.

This year marks the 75th anniversary of Cub Scouting, with Packs across the country marking the occasion with special recognition and events. This year, Pack 688 created a new design category for its Pinewood Derby, "Best 75th Anniversary Themed Car." Additionally, a special 75th Anniversary Award is available to the boys, their volunteer adult leaders, and their Pack.

LIBERTY DAY KIDS

ANNAPOLIS

A corner of Lawyer's Mall in the shadow of the Maryland State House was temporarily taken over by four Liberty Day Kids from the **Annapolis Area Christian School** on March 16 as part of the nationwide project to make kids the "teachers for the day" and quiz adults about the US Constitution. The Liberty Day Kids were easy to spot with their bright red tee shirts and carrying colorful bags containing the copies of the Constitution for distribution. Fifth graders **Travis Cole, Kyle Davis, Danny Mason, and Samuel Rogers**, led by AACS teacher, **Rene Wheeler**, approached over 100 adults on Lawyer's Mall, introduced themselves, asked them questions about the Constitution, and gave each respondent a small copy of the document for further review. The youngsters took special delight in finding the tough questions to ask. One stumper was, "What power does Congress have under the 16th amendment?" Answer; The power to levy and collect taxes on income. Several State Senators and Delegates were approached and graciously tried to answer the questions but did admit that some homework would be necessary. The majority of the adults thanked the Liberty Day Kids contingent and invited them to return next year. Another highlight of the morning in Annapolis occurred when Maryland Governor Robert Ehrlich and his security detail walked by the group on the Mall. A few moments later Senate President Mike Miller hurried by on his way to session. The kids all agreed that they had a lot to tell their classmates and parents later that day.

Liberty Day Kids is a nationwide project being done in every state and most state capitals on March 16, the birth date of James Madison, a writer of the original Constitution. In many areas the school civics or history classes have prepared the youngsters for the questions. Politicians have been invited to visit the schools and address the youngsters about government. The **Severn River Lions Club** is pleased to sponsor this learning activity.

SEVERNA PARK

Patrons approaching the circulation desk at the Severna Park Library on March 16 did not realize that the checkout process would include a test of their knowledge of the United States Constitution. Four Liberty Day Kids from the **Severna Park Middle School Youth Rise LEO Club** under the direction of faculty member, **Judy Crawford**, showed up wearing bright red tee shirts and carrying flag emblazoned bags. They watched while the adults checked out, then approached, introduced themselves, and quizzed the grown ups on various provisions of the document that has governed our daily lives for several centuries. Thoughtful deliberation, puzzlement, or a hesitant answer generally followed and the adults admitted that they were not as knowledgeable about the Constitution as they should be. LEO members **Joe Kerrigan, Katie Waksunski, Drew Overton, and Morgan Steele** supplied the correct answer, a page reference, a copy of the document for further study, and a "thank you" to each patron. It was obvious that the adults enjoyed this interaction with the kids that afternoon and the young teachers seemed to relish their role in challenging the adults. Even the library staff, with every reference book at their disposal, got involved in the exchange and had to admit that some additional study on their part was necessary.

The opportunity to raise citizen awareness and knowledge of the Constitution and provide a forum for a productive and positive interaction between adults and young people is a tenet of the Liberty Day Kids project and the **Severn River Lions Club** is pleased to be a sponsor.

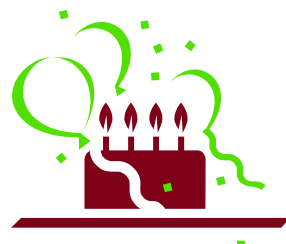
