MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS EVENT

On October 6th we held our Mental Health Awareness event, "Nourishing the Soul, Feeding the Stomach," over at the Arundel House of Hope (HOH). The event ran a bit longer than we expected, but in the end, we made a real difference!

I want to express my special thanks to several Lions who helped make today's event with Elevance Health (Well-Point) go so smoothly.

First - Lion Nancy, it was with her guidance and list of items that she usually uses in our club's lunches for HOH that we used as the baseline for our grant. When LCIF came back and asked us to add more, we changed the "one or another" to "one of each" on the food choices. Leftover food was brought over to help with this month's Homeless Lunches scheduled for October 23rd (watch for a separate needs list).

Second - Lion Sue, who helped me with the online ordering of items (from backpacks to pulled pork), designing & printing of labels, designing and printing of the backpack packing lists, donation of items, and keeping me sane, all while trying to do an MD-22 Convention Report and the program book for my social next month!

Third - Lion Chris for his donation of the granola bar snacks. Lion Jackie (who helped set up and then pack) and Lion Clem (for helping pack the backpacks) were recognized today.

Fourth - and a most appreciated thank you to our KL Laurajean, Lion Tilghman, Joe Brice, Drew Huff, and Alfred. KL Laurajean, Lion Tilghman, and Joe Brice helped by purchasing all the food and batteries at BJ's for any items that could not be ordered to be delivered on time. She also got her dentist to donate toothpaste and toothbrushes, which helped cut down our expenses. Plus, they helped offload boxes after boxes from my truck and then assembled items for the mental health initiative of today's event. Please make sure I receive those receipts.

The final count was 176 completed bags, with 5 bags containing only food (we ran out of certain items, so we were unable to create a mental health bag). However, we then donated all the other leftover items, several of which happen to be at the top of their "Needs" list.

The Elevance Health members were all given our club's membership brochures, and several had expressed interest in knowing more. Since Elevance does this type of event every October they have asked if we would partner with them again next year.

Breast Cancer Awareness Month 2025

WHAT IS BREAST CANCER?

Breast cancer is a disease in which cells in the breast grow out of control forming



tumors in the breast tissue. This occurs most frequently in women but can occur in men (ex. Richard Roundtree). Even though these cells start in the breast tissue, they are capable of traveling to other parts of the body via the bloodstream or lymphatic system. When it moves to other locations, it is called metastatic cancer.

RISKS, PREVENTION & SCREENINGS

Overall, your risks for breast cancer include family history of breast cancer or having the breast cancer gene (BRCA 1, BRCA2, etc), denser breasts, sedentary lifestyle, increased weight, hormone replacement therapy, or use of birth control. Your risk for developing breast cancer also increases with age or daily alcohol consumption. Therefore, you can decrease your risk by exercising, avoiding hormone replacement therapy if possible, maintaining a healthy weight, and drinking no more than 1 alcoholic beverage daily.

Screenings include breast self-exams and annual mammograms.

SIGNS & SYMPTOMS

- Swelling of all or part of a breast (even if no lump is felt)
- Skin dimpling (sometimes looking like an orange peel)
- Breast or nipple pain
- Nipple retraction (turning inward)
- · Nipple or breast skin that is red, dry, flaking, or thickened
- Nipple discharge (other than breast milk)
- Swollen lymph nodes under the arm or near the collar bone

TREATMENT OPTIONS

Breast cancer treatment depends on the size of the tumor and/ or spread of the disease. Treatment can be localized like surgical removal of the lump and radiation, or systemic options using any combination of the following therapies: complete mastectomy, radiation, chemotherapy, immunotherapy (using antibodies to target cancer cells), or hormone therapy.
