THE 47TH ANNUAL USA/CANADA LIONS LEADERSHIP FORUM



The 47th Annual USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum was held on September 21-23, 2023 in Reno, Nevada.

Lion Clem attended in addition to presenting a seminar titled: LEADERSHIP FOR EFECTIVE ORGANIZATIONS.

Content of the seminar – Sharing rewards of Leadership positions starting from club president to international president. Embarking on a support role for future leaders.

All seminars are 1 hour and 10 minutes in duration with interaction of their audience. The room seating is set up for 80 the same as all 88 seminars held during the Forum.

Sharing of past officer experiences takes place during each seminar to allow others the opportunity to hear success stories from Lions. In addition to presenting during the forum, Lion Clem attended two seminars;

We joined our Lions club so that we can fulfill a purpose. That purpose usually involves the service we provide as a Lion making a difference in our community. The Regional Lions Leadership Institute is designed for local Lions who have or wish to pursue leadership roles with their Lions providing service to their community. At the Institute you will learn about club operations, opportunities, and resources available to clubs, and gain both valuable leadership skills and a deeper understanding of how to better serve your clubs.

The Institute is offered at the local level and organized by regional leaders from Maryland and Delaware. Lion eligible for the Institute must be in good standing and want to better support multiple district or district initiatives. They should not have attended an Institute within the last five (5) years.

The Institute engages participants in an interactive learning environment by conducting question and answer segments, facilitating meaningful discussions in large and small group settings, and facilitating group activities. At least half of the faculty in each classroom must be a Faculty Development Institute graduate or Lions Certified Instructor Program certified.

The Institute curriculum is designed to recognize the structure of the association. Utilize a variety of strategies to move a team to a level of high performance. Develop strategies to effectively overcome the challenges of diversity in our clubs and districts. Implement techniques of effective speech delivery. Identify strategies for achieving effective time management. Complete a draft of a personal mission statement. Create an action plan for motivating Lions Club members. Set and prioritize goals.Many districts and some clubs provide scholarships to cover part of the cost of this training.

DIABETES AWARENESS MOMENT

ARM CIRCLES

With diabetes or prediabetes, exercise is essential for maintaining the body's health!

This exercise targets the shoulders.

MUSCLES USED - SHOULDER



Important Note: Exercise should be performed with slow and controlled movements. Stop if you feel pain. Gradually increase the number of circles over time. Exercise should be repeated 2-3 times. (Resting between sets)

PERFORMING THIS EXERCISE

- Stand comfortably with feet shoulder-width apart and knees slightly bent
- Extend your arms straight out to your sides (forming a "t" shape or cross) with your palms facing the ground.
- Rotate your arms forward in small circles 10 times followed by 10 small circles in the opposite direction
